BASIC WHISKEY SOUR

(4 tablespoons) Whiskey or Bourbon Whiskey

(2 tablespoons) lemon juice

(1 1/2 tablespoons) maple syrup (or sugar syrup)

Garnish: Orange peel

Ice to serve

1. Add the bourbon whiskey, lemon juice, and syrup to a cocktail shaker. Fill with a handful of ice and shake until very cold.

2. Strain the drink into a low ball glass. Serve with ice, and top with a slice of orange peel

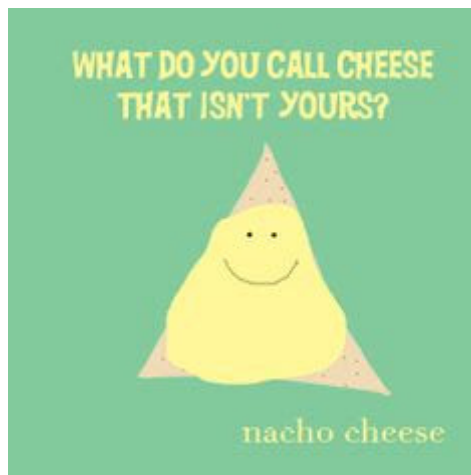
